The Rockefeller University is a world-renowned center for research and graduate education in the biomedical sciences, chemistry and biophysics. Founded by John D. Rockefeller in 1901 as the nation's first institute for medical research, the university has a laboratory-based structure that encourages interdisciplinary research. This innovative, collaborative approach has been an unparalleled success, contributing to 23 Nobel Prizes—including two prizes awarded to Rockefeller graduates, and eight to current faculty including Professors Günter Blobel, 1999; Paul Greengard, 2000; Paul Nurse, 2001; and Roderick MacKinnon, 2003.
