CCHMC is one of the nation's leading pediatric hospitals and is currently third among all pediatric hospitals in obtaining NIH funding (\$105 million in FY13).

The major emphasis of the over 80 laboratories of MDB faculty members at Cincinnati Children's is the study of molecular biology, embryonic development, birth defects, and human disease. The research covers a broad spectrum of currently relevant biomedical interests including Stem Cells, Cancer Biology, Genetics, Genomics, Systems Biology, Biomolecular Structure and Bioinformatics. Students receive their degree from the University of Cincinnati College of Medicine.

MDB students receive a competitive stipend. Most students can fulfill course requirements within 18 months of matriculation and then focus entirely on completing dissertation research. We offer them unsurpassed access to world class faculty in a superb training environment with ready access to clinically relevant research areas and patient populations. Students choose from potential faculty mentors by doing lab rotations throughout the first year. Students graduate on to a wide variety of successful careers after completing their training in the MDB program.
