Gaia is a space telescope that measures the position and velocities of stars in the Milky Way.

A new data release will be available on <u>June</u> <u>13</u>, and you can play with it! No prior knowledge of the dataset is required.

The Gaia data is the largest stellar catalog to date, with the velocities and positions of 1.8 billion stars in the Milky Way!
