As part of this special program, SSBAs will have the opportunity to:

- —Gain real-world experience with the broad range of work McKinsey consultants do, including serving clients as well as helping to build McKinsey's internal knowledge and capabilities
- —Build critical new skills within a training program specifically designed for the SSBA program
- —Participate in a number of social activities throughout the summer to help them get to know our firm culture and interact with other summer interns and members of our diversity communities

At the end of the summer, successful interns may receive offers to join us as full-time Business Analysts after the completion of their degrees.
