Blossoms Under a Full Moon(花好月圓) by Huang Yijun

Youth Ensemble/Conductor: Chi-Sun Chan

The piece was composed in 1923 by Huang Yijun and re-arranged by Peng Xiuwen in 1956. It describes people happily singing and dancing under a full moon.

Thirty Miles Village(三十哩鋪) adapted Northern Shan folk song

This selection tells of a true love story in a village called “Thirty Miles”, Suihe, Shanxi Province.

Cheerful Tidings from the Border(邊寨喜訊).....by gui xu li

Yangqin duet: Christine Chao & Christine Wu

This cheerful music describes the traveling of the good news as it reaches to the border providence of China.

Dai customs and scenery (傣族風情) by Wang Hui-Zhong

Sheng solo: Nicole Chen

The music portrays the mystical nature of the Dai nationality.

Living nearby water for over a thousand years, the Dai people created a unique culture of their own. This music vividly paints a happy scene of traditional customs with a background of beautiful scenery.

Battling with the Storm (戰颱風) by Chang-Yuan Wang

Guzheng solo: Emily Chen

This is a kind of programme music which depicts a picture of a great storm through the different techniques of the guzheng and expresses how the brave harbor workers battling with the storm at the pier

Galloping Across the Endless Grassland (奔馳在千里草原)

Erhu solo: Richard Ting

It depicts the people singing happily while riding horses, galloping across an endless Mongolian plain.

Longing for the Wei River (渭水情) Ren Hong-Xiang

Pipa solo: Bilin ZHuang

This pipa solo piece is based on the musical style of Shanxi folk song. It manifests the love towards their own land by the people living along the Wei River, which is in the province of Shanxi in Western China. The pipa piece starts with lyrical tunes, transits into fast and exciting melody, and follows by a slow but reverberating ending.

Butifuul Northern Shanxi (陝北好) by Gao Min

Dizi solo: Sara Li

This selection is based on the board and open melody of the Shanxi folk song Xin Tian You. It leads people to the yellow earth of a vast mountain gorge in Northern Shanxi. The cordial main melody is a beautiful song, symbolizing the warm and hearty nature of the vibrant Northern Shanxi people.

Spring Arrives at Yi River(春到沂河) by Wang Hui-ran

LiuQin Solo: Jun Cai

This piece was composed in the early 1970s'. It was commonly regarded as the representative Liuqin piece and has remained popular until today. Characterized with strong Shandong flavor, it shows the appealing scene of the arrival of spring. Everything along the Yi River has been revived and is full of vitality. In addition, the piece reveals the joyful feeling of people who are working happily in the fields and looking forward to the upcoming harvest.

New Tune of Silk and Bamboo(絲竹新韻) by Yang Chunlin

Ensemble/ Conductor: Chi-Sun Chan

“Silk-Bamboo” is a type of music popular in the Jiangnan region, south of the Yangzi River. The main instruments are the Erhu (silk strings) and the Dizi (bamboo). This type of classical music is typically flowing and elegant. Though based on the classical silk-bamboo style, the composer adds a distinctly new flavor to this piece of music.

Gathering of the Heroes (風云際會) by Xia Yan

On this cheerful occasion, ranking officials gather and loud, joyous music fills the air.

New Year Festivities (開新春).....by Yang Chunlin
