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## Under the Geological Rug: Leakage, Mixing and Trapping in Carbon Sequestration

Geological storage of carbon dioxide (CO<sub>2</sub>) in deep saline aquifers forms an integral part of many CO<sub>2</sub> mitigation strategies. At depth CO<sub>2</sub> is buoyant and therefore may leak into surface waters or the atmosphere. This talk will explore the rich multiphase fluid dynamics of CO<sub>2</sub> propagation, providing constraints on the rate at which CO<sub>2</sub> may leak from a storage site, and the dynamics of convective dissolution and capillary trapping, two leading processes by which CO<sub>2</sub> may be stably trapped and stored within the subsurface.
