



# 2012 Clean Energy Education & Empowerment Awards

*Recognizing women's leadership and accomplishments in clean energy*

The Clean Energy Education and Empowerment Initiative (C3E) is an effort to advance the careers and leadership of women in the field of clean energy. C3E is an international initiative within the Clean Energy Ministerial dialog. C3E partner governments are committed to advancing professional women in clean energy in their societies.

The U.S. Department of Energy has partnered with the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) to work to promote C3E goals.

**MIT has spearheaded a C3E Awards program to recognize mid-career leadership and accomplishments in clean energy. C3E Awards winners will be named at a Symposium in Cambridge, Massachusetts, on September 28, 2012. Each C3E Award carries a \$10,000 cash prize.**
