Fellowships are generally merit-based internal or external awards that support a student in a full-time course of study. Most fellowships are geared toward graduate students, whereas scholarships, which are generally tuition-only opportunities, are more often geared toward undergraduates. In addition, fellowships often open a wide variety of doors, allowing access to unique networks and events.
