Goals of HCA Committee

- On paper: The HCA committee focuses on community issues and student services that pertain to the entire graduate population. The committee's work focuses on ensuring that the MIT graduate experience is *enjoyable*, *affordable*, *safe*, *healthy*, and marked by a *welcoming* community.
- What HCA has to offer (in practice):
 - Transfer of knowledge (i.e. Housing updates) between chairs and members
 - Focal Point for discussions between admin + students
 - Gauge pulse of student body on specific issues (through HCA discussions and surveys which are administered by HCA)
 - Stipend Recommendation has been under HCA domain since 2003
 - Subcommittees work on wide variety of initiatives related to creating enjoyable (OCH), affordable (stipends), safe (Transportation), healthy (Sustainability) and welcoming (Irefs, Family) community






Main HCA-centric Initiatives from Past Year

- Interfacing w/ Dorm Representatives
- Enabling communication between MIT Offices (Housing, OVC) and GSC leaders
- Involving more students in the stipend recommendation (resulted in a focus on more targeted programming)

Transportation Subcommittee

- Goal: support and advocate for grad students as they get to/from work and around the area
- 2019–2020
 - Bike safety event (w/ MIT Police)
 - Liaison to MIT Committee on Transportation and Parking
 - Taking the pulse interviewing/surveying grad students
 - Transportation guide for orientation (draft)





Off-campus housing (OCH)

- About 60% of graduate students live off campus
- Organized ~3 social events per month (until March 2020) each with 10-12 students
 - E.g., Aquarium visit, Harvard Square chocolate tour, Charles River boat cruise, comedy night, Restaurant week lunches and dinners
- Pioneered a larger end-of-semester group event (~30 people)
- Initiated survey on how OCH can better serve students living off-campus (still collecting responses)
- Ideas for next year:
 - Orientation event to connect students living in the same neighborhood
 - More large group events to involve greater share of students

- Confidential, peer-to-peer conflict management coaching
- Open to all graduate students across campus
- 10 active members
- 2-3 in-person meetings/semester/REFS
- Working with OGE and GCF on REFS administration, coordination, and continuity
- Support to new REFS groups
- Pilot with GSC officers for confidential feedback
