



Teaching Opportunity in Undergraduate Seminar Program SAGES Fellow, 2012-13

Case Western Reserve University seeks candidates for full-time lecturers' positions in SAGES (the Seminar Approach to General Education and Scholarship). The lecturers will lead interdisciplinary, discussion-based, writing-intensive classes that contribute to undergraduate students' understanding of the natural world, the process of scientific inquiry, or the development and dissemination of technology. Seminars may also explore related topics such as the history of science and medicine or issues in environmental or energy policy.

We welcome applications from postdoctoral candidates with substantial teaching experience as well as from senior scholars. Application materials (a letter of interest, a CV including names and email addresses of two references, a writing sample, and a 3- to 4-page seminar proposal) should be submitted electronically to ase7@case.edu.
