The [Department of History at the University of Texas at Arlington](#) invites applicants for a full-time tenure-track position in the History of East Asian Science and Technology with a preferred starting date in August 2022. The successful candidate will commit to offering both lower-division surveys in World Civilization as well as upper-division courses in the candidate's areas of expertise. The Department particularly welcomes applicants from scholars whose work involves transnational or comparative perspectives and who are able to offer courses covering regions beyond East Asia including undergraduate surveys in the History of US Science and Technology. We also welcome candidates possessing a secondary field (or demonstrated expertise) in digital humanities, oral history, public history, museum studies, or archival administration.

The University of Texas at Arlington is a Carnegie Research-1 "highest research activity" institution. Applicants are expected to provide evidence of effective teaching, an ability to produce high-quality scholarly research, and a commitment to community service and outreach. Successful candidates are expected to demonstrate a commitment to diversity and equity in education through their scholarship, teaching, and/or service. Salary will be commensurate with background and experience.

Following an initial assessment, applicants may be asked to forward a writing sample and representative syllabi of courses taught or proposed. Official transcripts will be required prior to appointment. An earned Doctorate by the time of appointment is required. Exceptional candidates at the rank of Associate Professor may be considered.

Review of applications will begin immediately and continue until the position is filled. For full consideration, please submit all required materials no later than **March 7, 2022**.
