The Management Department in the College of Business Administration at Kansas State University (http://cba.ksu.edu) is seeking to hire an assistant professor for a tenure-track appointment in Operations and Supply Chain Management (OSCM). Required: (1) A Ph.D. or equivalent degree in an OSCM-related field from an AACSB accredited Business School (or must be within six months of degree completion at the start of contract); (2) demonstrated preparation for conducting high quality research and publishing in high quality journals in the OSCM discipline; (3) demonstrated preparation for high quality teaching in supply chain management, operations management, and transportation/logistics; and (4) ability to contribute to the service mission of the college. Preferred: Preference will be given to candidates with (1) strong research records as demonstrated through publications in top academic journals and presentations at national academic conferences; (2) prior university teaching experience in supply chain management, operations management, and/or business/data analytics; (3) strong interpersonal and communication skills; (4) related professional work experience, and (5) demonstrated interest in working with multicultural students and diverse populations. Responsibilities include conducting and publishing academic research and teaching two courses per semester, along with assisting in the service mission of the Department, College and University.
