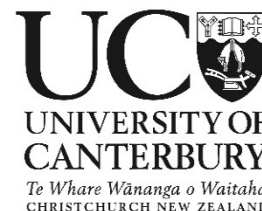

### **What You Will Do**

The UC Business School invites applications for the continuing/tenured position of Lecturer/Senior Lecturer in Supply Chain Management within UC's Management, Marketing and Entrepreneurship department. We are seeking to appoint an outstanding scholar to contribute to the development of our rapidly growing Operations and Supply Chain Management group. The group has a strong focus on supply chain sustainability to support the University's strategic mission of 'engaging, empowering and making a difference'. Applicants conducting research in the procurement/sourcing domain of supply chain management are particularly invited to apply, with the expectation of being able to teach at both the undergraduate and post-graduate levels. Applicants should have experience and/or be willing to teach basic and advanced courses in project management as well.

### **Who You Are**

Applicants should have a strong record of empirically-based publications in internationally recognised high-quality academic journals; some experience in the supervision of thesis students (commensurate with the academic rank being applied for); experience in academic leadership (also commensurate with academic rank); and have a student-centred teaching philosophy that aligns well with UC's graduate profile. Experience in securing research grants is desirable. The successful appointee will display the following attributes:

- PhD in a subject relevant to the position. Applicants close to finalizing their PhD will be also considered
- Record of high research productivity, or clear potential thereof
- Ability to teach undergraduate and postgraduate courses in supply chain management
- Strong interpersonal communication and communication skills, people leadership and capability building skills.
- A flexible and collegial approach to research and teaching
- Experience in connecting with industry and other stakeholders
- Active commitment to continuing personal professional development including bicultural professional development and applying learnings in everyday practices. An active commitment to upholding the values, tikanga, kawa and traditions as guided by Ngāi Tūāhuriri, the mana whenua.
- Ability in te reo Māori me ōna tikanga would be an advantage.
