Fundraising is crucial to this role as numerous student activities such as Women in Supply Chain, Applied Learning projects, and Coaches Corner are supported thorough center funds.
- b. Teaching and instruction to support the college's curricular offerings in the highly applied and experiential undergraduate Operations and Supply Chain Management (OSCM) major (https://www.marquette.edu/business/undergraduate/majors/operations-supply-chain.php) and online MS in SCM (https://www.marquette.edu/business/graduate/master-supply-chain.php). As such, individuals with demonstrated ability to effectively deliver a variety of pedagogical approaches will be preferred. Additionally, as an Instructor of Practice, an ideal candidate will provide student advising and mentoring, promote an environment of ethics-based instruction in keeping with Marquette University's Jesuit, catholic ideals, and enhance teaching opportunities for the OSCM programs through the Center's engagements.

The Center for SCM (https://www.marquette.edu/business/supply-chain/) is not only a place of academic excellence, it also is a driver for value-added engagement between OSCM faculty, students, and the industry. With its recent revisioning, the center is poised to take a leadership role in the Midwest to deliver knowledge and talent in digital transformation of supply chains.
