The Faculty of Agribusiness and Commerce is seeking applications for an academic with expertise in supply chain management to join our team. There is a strong focus on applied and interdisciplinary teaching and research linked to this focus.

You will be part of our supply chain management group, which delivers courses for our supply chain management programme, as well as contributing to other business management related courses to support the Faculty's majors in Marketing, Hotel & Tourism Management, Global Business, Sustainability, and agribusiness.

Key tasks of the role include:

- Initiate, develop and conduct high quality research.
- Advance and enhance the teaching of undergraduate and postgraduate students.
- Contribute to the supervision of postgraduate students' research.
