

Funded research stays at the Politecnico of Milano and at the Politecnico of Torino for MIT Ph.D. students.

To encourage two-way exchanges between MIT and Italy's two best engineering schools, the Politecnico of Milano and the Politecnico of Torino, research stays opportunities for MIT graduate students and advanced undergraduates in all the engineering fields are available through the MIT-Italy Program.

Research stays may vary in length from a minimum of one month to a maximum of six months. They may take place within an ongoing research collaboration between an MIT and a Politecnico faculty, or they may provide an opportunity for the participating students and research groups to familiarize themselves with research taking place at PoliMI and PoliTO.

Awards are commensurate to the length of stay, and deadlines and formalities vary, depending on whether students are interested in the Politecnico of Torino –see the MITOR website <http://web.mit.edu/mitor/index.html>—or in the Politecnico of Milano—see the Progetto Rocca site <http://web.mit.edu/progettorocca/fellowships/research.html>. To encourage the flow of MIT students to Italy, procedures are quite simple and deadlines are quite flexible.

Applicants should submit their CV, academic transcript, a short statement describing the purpose of their proposed stay, a letter by a MIT faculty in support of their application, and a letter of acceptance by a Politecnico faculty host.
