2010 Minority Faculty Development Workshop (MFDW) Information Sheet

The NSF Minority Faculty Development Workshop was founded to provide an ongoing mechanism to support the career development and retention of faculty from underrepresented groups. The 2010 NSF MFDW, co-organized by Georgia Tech and MIT, will take place from March 21st to 24th at Massachusetts Institute of Technology in Cambridge, Massachusetts. The workshop theme is "*Engineering Faculty Success*" and workshop sessions will equip tenure-track junior and mid-level science and engineering faculty with tools and strategies to better navigate their careers. Workshop participants are drawn from U.S. four-year institutions and represent the spectrum of engineering and science disciplines.



MIT will host the 2010 MFDW National Faculty Collaborative Research Poster Competition on Monday, March 22nd, from 3:30pm to 5:30pm in Lobby 13. The poster competition is part of the NSF 2010 Minority Faculty Development Workshop that is taking place from March 22nd to 24th at MIT. The competition features over fifty faculty scholars from various universities across the United States showcasing their science and engineering research. Posters are organized along several broad categories, including Biomedical, Chemical, Civil, Computer Science, Electrical, Materials, and Mechanical Engineering, and STEM Education. This event is open to the MIT community and to the public.

History of the MFDW

Evolving from the efforts of a group of chemical engineering faculty to provide and sustain a network to support their career advancement, the 2010 workshop is the fifth of a series of workshops that were held in 2001, 2004, 2006, and 2009. What began as informal get-togethers at the primary professional meeting for chemical engineers led to a successful NSF workshop proposal and establishment of a model program for engineering and science faculty development.
