What is an AWIS mentoring circle?

A mentoring circle is a small group of women scientists committed to meeting monthly to support each other with advice, encouragement and information. Each circle will consist of 3-5 peers and will be coordinated by at least one experienced mentor and one connector.

Who will be in my circle?

The MASS AWIS mentoring committee will review submitted surveys and match you with a circle based on interests, career goals, geography and other factors.

What will we talk about?

You will decide as a group which topics you would like to discuss, but MASS AWIS will provide you with a sourcebook to give you initial ideas. Once you get started we don't think you'll have trouble finding things to talk about! All participants should be willing to both give and receive professional and personal support from other talented women in the scientific community.

Are we just going to sit around and complain?

NO!! The mentoring circle can be a mechanism for sharing frustrations with peers but the focus is on career growth and problem solving in a supportive environment. Mentors will help guide and promote productive discussions in the circle.

Who are Connectors?

Connectors are ombudsmen for the mentoring circles. If a mentor or mentee is experiencing conflict or frustration within the circle, the connector will step in to mediate the situation.
