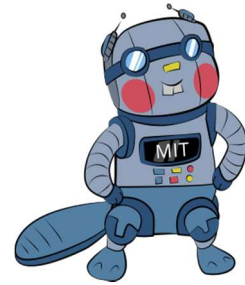


# MIT RoboCon 2017
