

Throughout the month of January, students participating in the seminar have developed a proposal to reduce greenhouse gas emissions in Cambridge through Community-Based Social Marketing (CBSM). CBSM includes a set of strategies specifically targeted to promote action by individuals.

At the beginning of this month, students attended an intensive week of briefing sessions on climate change, ongoing action in Cambridge and local initiatives to respond to climate change. The following two weeks were spent solely on developing their project proposals on a topic they have selected from the priorities of the Cambridge Climate Protection Plan. In the final week students refine their proposal and presentation, and will offer their ideas for your consideration.
