
WHO FOUND THOREAU

Self-taught archaeologist, Roland Robbins discovered the site of Thoreau's famed Walden Pond cabin in 1945. He then built a career uncovering nationally important historic and industrial sites along the east coast.

Robbins used still-debated techniques, yet made incredible discoveries and shared his finds with presentations to over 60,000 people over his career.

Despite his success many formally trained archaelogists criticized his methods, and his career remains controversial. Robbins' life serves as a helpful window to discuss the goals and methods of archaeology.
