Training for Lectors, Altar Servers, and Extraordinary Ministers: If you have received the sacrament of Confirmation, you can be eligible to serve at Mass as a lector, or as an altar sever and Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion. How does the Church think about secular politics? The Church is a community with supernatural origins which is composed, at least partially, by people who live in this world and have to organize themselves into societies and nations. Prof. Chad Pecknold of the Catholic University of America will be giving the first Thomistic Institute lecture of the year, "Augustine's *City of God* and the Nature of Politics." Prof. Pecknold is the author of *Christianity and Politics:* A *Brief Guide to the History*, and is a frequent commentator regarding the intersection on Christianity and politics on television and print media. The talk will focus on the classic statement of the relation of Church to the state as given by St. Augustine, and how that applies to politics today right before the national midterm elections. It is meant to be both a high-level introduction to the faith appropriate for interested non-Catholics, and a serious review of the faith for those who are Catholics. It is required for those who want to enter the Church. Classes will start in early October and run for the rest of the year.
