The Gold Mass is in the tradition of special Masses for members of different professions. Called the Gold Mass as gold is the color of the hood worn by individuals graduating with a Ph.D. in science. The oldest Mass for professions, the Red Mass, began in the 13th century for lawyers and lawmakers. The first White Mass for health care professionals and Blue Mass for law enforcement were introduced in the 1930s. The first Gold Mass for scientists and engineers was held at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology on Nov. 15, 2016.
