Follow-Up Discussion: On Thursday, 4/20 at 8pm in W11/ MDR we will have a follow-up discussion on Br. Guy Consolmagno’s Lecture “From Galileo to Laudato Si’: Why Science Needs Faith”.

“Extraterrestrial Life and Catholic Theology”: Sunday, April 23, 2023 at 6:30-8:00 PM in W11/Main Dining Room.

New methods in astronomy and new models in evolutionary biology have opened up new expectations that we humans may not be alone in the cosmos. How are Christian theologians to consider this in light of what God has revealed in the Incarnation of his Son in Christ? In this lecture, Prof. Chris Baglow, the Director of the Science and Religion Initiative at the McGrath Institute for Church Life at the University of Notre Dame, will draw upon the thought of classical and modern theologians to propose some possibilities for what Christians might expect to discover if the universe is inhabited by other species who, like Homo sapiens, are created in the divine image.

Summer Seminar: This summer, COLLIS Institute for Catholic Thought and Culture and the Lumen Christi Institute at the University of Chicago are co-organizing a summer seminar for undergraduate students at Cornell campus. The program, “Explorations in Integral Ecology: Science, Theology, Creation,” offers a weeklong intensive seminar integrating theological study with direct scientific observation of the natural world and experiences of creation. The lead instructors are Sr. Damien Savino (Dean of Science and Sustainability, Aquinas College), and Fr. Terry Ehrman (Department of Theology, University of Notre Dame). The Program is free (incl. lodging), and accepted applicants receive a \$350 stipend to offset travel costs.
