Arts at MIT: mural collaboration with Borderlines underway (painting ongoing in the banana lounge); student art now hanging throughout the lounge

Banana lounge: all stocked and running; bringing in new furniture (including exercise balls) soon; following up with Chiquita on specific banana quality issues; adding a second compost bin; two team members visited banana farms in Central America over IAP (not UA funded) following the supply chain from farm to MIT, to investigate specific quality issues we've been facing, share the story of where our bananas come from and the people and systems behind them with the MIT community, and for independent research

BetterMIT: ran the second annual BetterMIT Innovation Challenge in collaboration with *UA Tech*, a week long event to bring students and admins together to build a better MIT for a better world; events included a kickoff dinner, speaker series, workshops, panel collaborations with the *College of Computing* launch, and a weekend hackathon

Campus corners: investigating spaces for collaborative play (a "playground") and for napping (separate spaces)

Good grub: preparing to pilot *Clover* food deliveries to the banana lounge; working with the students behind "Maize," an MIT campus food delivery startup and Prof. Bathe

MIT and the world: took 15 students (randomly selected from a dormspam interest form) out to see an improv comedy show; a pilot of a longer term project to help students get off campus and explore our relationship with the surrounding community and the world

Space of Quiet: continuing our development of 50-305 as a space for reflection and contemplation, working with the MIT Office of Religious Spiritual and Ethical Life; launched a student survey to hear ideas and concerns (650 responses so far); seeking an April/May opening


