## **Becoming a Candidate**

To become an official candidate in the election, you must first notify the Commission and your class of your intent to run. This consists of three things:

- 1. Fill out the **Google Form** corresponding to the race you are entering. If you would like a **photograph** of yourself to appear on the ballot (which we strongly recommend), please email it to the Election Commission at <a href="mailto:ua-elect@mit.edu">ua-elect@mit.edu</a> along with your name and the position you are running for.
- 2. Collect signatures from your classmates. These signatures are called your "petition" to run. To be listed on the ballot, each candidate for Class Council must collect at least 125 and no more than 185 signatures. Each ticket for UA President and VP must collect at least 495 and no more than 740 signatures. Signatories must be currently enrolled students; they must write their full name and current residence (name of dorm building or "off-campus") in the space provided. It is important to understand that the purpose of the petitions is not to campaign, and it may not be used as such. See the rules about campaigning for more information. If you are running as part of a ticket for Publicity Chair or Social Chair, you only need to collect one set of signatures.
- 3. You must sign an official **statement of candidacy**, which can be found in this packet. Turn in this statement along with **proof of registration**, which can be obtained by going to 11-120 with an MIT ID.

The petition signatures, statement of candidacy, and proof of registration must be submitted to the Election Commission in W20-401 by **Friday, March 22**<sup>th</sup> **5:00 pm**.
